***Job Opportunities with United Space Alliance (USA) at NASA Johnson**

Representatives from United Space Alliance will be on campus this **Wednesday, March 26** to talk with and interview candidates interested jobs as Flight Controllers- Instructor Role. They are looking for engineers who possess excellent communication skills and who have interest in the US Human Spaceflight program. These positions require achieving a NASA certification as a Flight Controller-Instructor (Engineer) on one or more of the ISS (International Space Station) systems. As a Flight Controller/Instructor, the individual will be responsible for operating their respective system of the ISS vehicle from a Flight Control console located in the Mission Control Center (MCC) Houston. Flight Controller duties will involve providing operational support towards the development, implementation, modification, testing, verification, validation, troubleshooting and repair of an ISS' Subsystem while maintaining that system's safety. This includes integrating requirements and systems across flight elements. In addition, as an Instructor, the individual will be responsible for training Astronauts, Cosmonauts, Instructors, and Flight Controllers on the onboard systems of the ISS. These United Space Alliance positions require successful completion of a government background check before commencement of employment. If you are not a United States Citizen, this check could take up to 12 months to be completed. (For further information about the position, visit Opportunities on the AE Dept. Web site.)

There will be a briefing to interested students on these career opportunities from 5 pm – 6 pm, Mar. 26 in Rm. 106B3, Engineering Hall. At the 5 pm session, USA will sign up students for interviews the next day (Thurs., Mar. 27). USA reps will also have an information table on the First Floor, east entrance (Quad side) of Talbot Lab from 10 am – 3 pm, Wed. Mar. 26
